Across the country, classrooms are finding creative ways to add language and culture to their curricula. Here are some of the many ways our schools have made the most out of Mango.



High School

Middle School

Some of our middle schools have chosen **exploratory language study**, introducing a new language every few weeks, or encouraging **independent study**. This early exposure gives students a foundation to choose a language of interest and continue learning.

Elementary

Music and art can take students around the world, so why not bring Mango along? Our elementary schools have folded Mango into the arts, helping younger students express themselves through different modes of learning.

FOR EXAMPLE: *If an artist or an artistic style from another country is the focus, students can then blend newly learned words, phrases, or concepts into their work.*

Collaborative Book

Activity Category:	Small and Whole Group Instruction
Materials:	Online presentation software (Google Slides, PowerPoint, etc.)
Time:	60-120 minutes

Procedure
1. Upon completion of a chapter in Mango Languages, students will be put into groups of two to four, and create a book detailing a story while also relating their understanding of the content. a. For example: If the food and drink chapter was just completed, students would create a book about going to a restaurant and detail the conversation between the guest and the waiter.
2. Students will work collaboratively within an online presentation software to create their book in accordance with the rubric .
3. Once their book is created, students will record themselves reading their book and submit to the teacher, or present to the class.

Adaptation for Novice Language Learners:
For novice language learners, each student should be in charge of creating one page independently for the book. Most of their presentation should be in the target language, although sentences will be less complex.

Adaptation for Intermediate Language Learners:
For intermediate language learners, each student should be in charge of creating two to three pages independently for the book. Most of their presentation should be in the target language.

Adaptation for Intermediate High/Advanced Low Language Learners:
For intermediate high/advanced low language learners, each student should be in charge of creating four to five pages independently for the book. Students can consider creating chapters within their collaborative book design. Their entire presentation should be in the target language.

English Learners

Newcomers are able to rapidly build their English from more than 20 source languages, helping ELs keep up with their peers.

Teachers, Virtual Classrooms and Summer Break
